Life starts right as the central yolk splits in two. It then divides into four, then eight, etc.- until it looks a bit like a raspberry inside a jello cup. Soon, the embryo starts to look more and more like a tadpole, getting longer and moving about in it's egg. Usually, about 6-21 days (average!) after being fertilized, the egg will hatch.

Life Cycle of a Frog

White's tree frogs (*Litoria caerulea*) commonly live to 16 years when kept indoors, the oldest known specimen living to 21 years. The life span of a tree frog in the wild is much shorter. The most common indoor pet, the red-eyed tree frog (*Agalychnis callidryas*), averages only 5 years in the wild like other frog species.
